Annual Report for Session 2010/2011

Introduction

HKIE-YMC was established in 1985 and its vision throughout these 26 years is to serve the need of young members and nurture young engineers to become future leaders in the engineering industry, the society and the international. With over four thousand and six hundred Registered Young Members (RYMs) from 20 engineering disciplines, HKIE-YMC stands alone as one of the most prominent young engineers' bodies in Hong Kong.

To facilitate the young engineers in tackling the new challenges such as increasing expectation from public on engineer, visibility of engineer in the community, climate change issue, striking for a better living environment etc. We organized a series of events with the theme “Think Out of the Box; Inspire the Next Generation” in this session. We would like to widen the exposure of young engineers on sustainable development in different aspects from personal, technical to practical and enhance their contribution to the community and the industry.

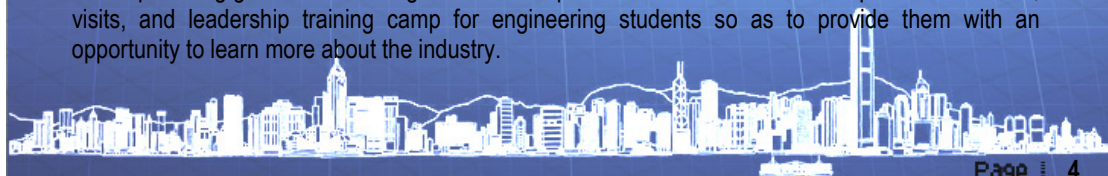
With the support from Past Chairmen, leadership of Committee Members, Co-opted Members and Events Coordinators as well as efforts from over three hundred helpers, we continue to organize activities in twelve areas, including students promotion, graduates promotion, technical seminars, technical visits, non-technical programmes, community services, sports & recreation, public relations, social, culture & arts, human resources, publicity and webmaster. In particular, HKIE-YMC focuses on the following aspects based on the theme of this session.

Enhancing Members' Sustainable Development Technically and Personally

As a learned society, we continued to organize series of technical seminars and visits to broaden members' knowledge by bringing different professionals to present at quality events. In addition, we encouraged members' personal development by organizing various work-life balance programme from soft skills to leisure events. We also increased members' exposure in the international arena by organizing overseas delegation, attending international conferences and hosting young engineers from overseas. We organized an Overseas Delegation to UK, Mainland Delegation to Sichuan and sent delegates to take part in the Conference of ASEAN Federation of Engineering Organization in Vietnam and Dragon 100 in Shanghai. Moreover, we hosted various young engineering organizations from mainland to overseas when they visited Hong Kong.

Encouraging Members' Contribution to the Community and Industry

We organized various community services from elderly visit to mentorship programme to help the underprivileged as well as to promote engineer's image. We also took lead in the Joint Young Professional Group in the construction industry including engineers, planners, surveyors, lawyers and arbitrators to co-organize one day seminar on contract management as well as community services. With the help and support from the HKIE Council and Secretariat, HKIE-YMC took active role in providing guidance to the eight student chapters. We also held membership and career talks, visits, and leadership training camp for engineering students so as to provide them with an opportunity to learn more about the industry.





Working Group Report

Highlights of activities organized by each working group are presented as follows:

Enhancing Members' Sustainable Development Technically and Personally

Seminars Group (SG)

Time flies fast. It almost comes to the end of the Session 2010/2011. To conform the theme of our seminar group for this session, we organized a number of seminars on topics related to the “Low Carbon engineering” and the infrastructure projects.



Same as previous year, we selected topics on the latest technologies and infrastructure projects to our young engineers, so that they can grasp the updated engineering development in Hong Kong. Last year, we organized a seminar namely “Technical Seminar on Route 8 Traffic Control Surveillance System”, which is considered to be the most advanced and complex traffic control system in Hong Kong. In this seminar, the speaker introduced the concept design and shared with us the challenges encountered from the project.

Regarding the Low Carbon engineering, there are numerous seminars bringing the latest sustainable development and design concepts that is valuable and worth for young engineers to consider in their engineering design work. Examples included “Zero-Emission Pilot Project in Chongqing, Sichuan Province” and “Sustainable developments in Water Engineering”

We are pleased to work for the seminars group as it is one of the major working groups in HKIE-YMC to provide technical knowledge to our young engineers. We hope all the participants can widen their horizons from these seminars in addition to the knowledge they learn and the experience they gain from work.

Last but not least, we would like to give our sincere gratitude to all lovely and energetic helpers. They paid much effort and spent their time in assisting the seminars. We are also proud of having them to join our HKIE-YMC big family, we hope they enjoy working with us and they have a prosperous future. Visits Group (VG)

HKIE-YMC Overseas Delegation 2011 to UK – Engineering London and beyond 2012

Since 1991, HKIE-YMC has been organising delegations to different parts of the world, including mainland China, Southeast Asia, Middle East, Europe and Australia. This session, HKIE-YMC jointly organised a delegation to UK with the HKIE-CPDC. It is our honour to have invited 6 distinguished senior members from the HKIE as our advisors. And some of our advisers including Ir Prof Reuben Chu, the President of the HKIE, Ir Dr FC Chan, the Senior Vice President of the HKIE, Ir KK Choy, Vice President of the HKIE, Ir Otto Poon, Past President of the HKIE and Ir Gary Ko, the Chairman of the HKIE-CPDC joined this delegation trip with 15 young engineers from 20th to 26th March 2011.

The theme of this delegation is “Engineering London for and beyond 2012”. We are intended to study how London is revitalized by the opportunity of hosting Olympics 2012. To this end, three different study groups which include Town Planning, Infrastructure and Olympic Facility were established. Our study focuses do not limit to the state-of-the-art technologies but also how to utilise the venues, infrastructures after the game. Most importantly, how could this game bring long-term benefit to the citizens in London.

Apart from technical visits, we visited several overseas institutes viz. Imperial College, the Institution of Civil Engineers (ICE) – Graduates and Students Network (GSNet), the Institution of Engineering and Technology (IET), the Institution of Mechanical Engineers (IMechE) and the HKIE UK Chapter. Through these activities, we develop our networks with engineers in UK and understand the working atmosphere there.

Beside overseas visits, we arranged local events which were under the theme of this delegation. It is believe that these events could benefit more members. A seminar and a report which present our finding in this delegation are scheduled to be held and published in June 2011.

Supporting the theme “Think out of the box; Inspire the Next Generation” of HKIE-YMC in this session, CSG has specially launched the first mentorship scheme of HKIE-YMC with the support from Boys' & Girls' Clubs Association of Hong Kong (BGCA).

In this flagship event “HKIE-YMC Mentorship Scheme 2010/2011”, one-year 1-1 mentorship services have been provided by 40 selected young engineers to young students aged from 10 to 16 who are living under the poverty line and need a guide for their futures. By providing the 1-1 mentorship services as well as joining different centralized functions, the selected young engineers have helped encourage the children to go for the right track of their futures. They were also responsible for explaining the work nature of an engineer to the teenagers and promoting the engineering profession to them. All the mentors have been fully supported by HKIE-YMC and BGCA by different communication skills workshop and centralized functions.



Besides the mentorship scheme, CSG has continued to provide different opportunities for our young members to serve the society. Various kinds of community services have been organized, including visiting the elderly with moon cake distribution in the Mid-Autumn Festival, helping the elderly for home cleaning before the Lunar New Year and having outing with children who are living under the poverty line, etc. Similar to previous years, CSG has also supported and joined different fund-





raising events. This year, we have participated in Thalassaemia Flag Day, Sowers Action Challenging 12 Hours 2010 and ORBIS-Bupa Moonwalkers 2010, etc, to raise funds for the needy. CSG has had a remarkable session in serving the community through organizing and joining different functions. 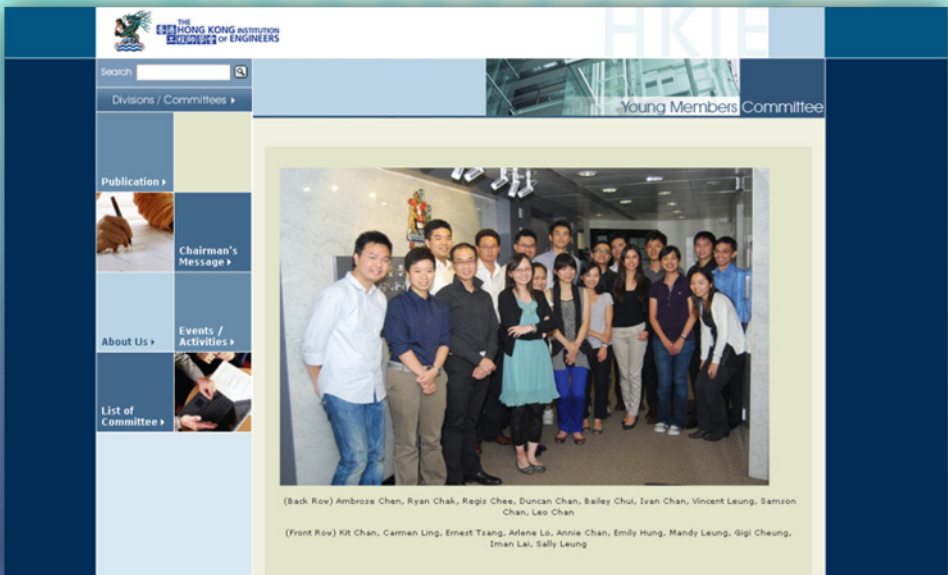
Webmaster Group (WMG)

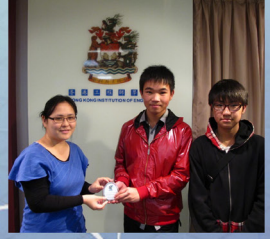
